Our Record:

To date we have awarded over 180 scholarships for nearly \$140,000.

Our Expenses:

We have an all-volunteer board, and no paid staff, so almost all of our donations go directly into our scholarships.

To Qualify:

An applicant must be an ethnic minority student attending school in the Salem-Keizer 24J School District geographical area, including the Chemawa Indian School.

Scholarship Use:

The scholarships can be used for study at any college, public or private, junior college, community college, as well as any certified technical training program. The money is paid directly to the school to be used by the student for academic expenses only.
